Word Origin:

[**defunct**] mid 16th cent. (in the sense 'deceased'): from Latin **defunctus** 'dead', past participle of **defungi** 'carry out, finish', from **de-** (expressing reversal) + **fungi** 'perform'.

Example Bank:

- He wrote for the now defunct newspaper, the Daily Correspondent
- He wrote many articles for the now sadly defunct newspaper, the Daily Correspondent
- The LP was made defunct by the arrival of the CD.
- These machines are now considered defunct.
- the ruined buildings of a long defunct mine
