■ verbs

- **meet a requirement** (=have or do what is needed) We finally found a house that seemed to meet all of our requirements.
- **satisfy/fulfil a requirement** *formal* (=meet them) Our aim is to satisfy our customers' requirements.
- **comply with requirements** *formal* (=have or do what a rule or law says is necessary) Failure to comply with these requirements is a criminal offence.
- **impose requirements** *formal* (=state that something has to be done) Because the regulations impose new requirements on small businesses, they will prove costly.
- **suit sb's requirements** (=be suitable for someone in a particular situation) You could design and build your own house to suit your requirements.

- **a special requirement** He modified the car to suit his own special requirements.
- **a basic requirement** Water is a basic requirement of life.
- **an essential requirement** Confidence is an essential requirement for success.
- **a minimum requirement** That certificate is a minimum requirement for entry to music college.
- **a legal/statutory requirement** There is no legal requirement to carry identity papers.
- **safety requirements** All companies are required to meet Health and Safety requirements.
- **entry requirements** (=the skills, qualifications etc you must have in order to enter a school, university, or country, or to do a course) Applicants must satisfy the normal entry requirements for the programme.
- **energy requirements** (=the amount of energy a place or person needs) 65 percent of the country's energy requirements were met by imported oil.
