Word Origin:

early 17th cent. (originally in the sense of a younger son or daughter): from French, from Gascon dialect **capdet**, a diminutive based on Latin **caput** 'head'. The notion "little head" or "inferior head" gave rise to that of 'younger, junior'.

Example Bank:

- The military academy trains up to 2 000 officer cadets each year.
