 - an indemnity clause/fund/policy
 - indemnity insurance
2. **countable** a sum of money that is given as payment for damage or loss

Word Origin:late Middle English: from French *indemnité*, from late Latin *indemnitas*, from *indemnis* 'unhurt, free from loss'.Example Bank:

- Our client will seek an indemnity from the vendor for a breach of contract.
- The defeated nations were forced to pay an indemnity of \$800 million.
