Word Origin:
 late 16th cent. (in the sense 'relating to music, musical'): via Latin from Greek *harmonikos*, from *harmonia* 'joining, concord', from *harmos* 'joint'.

noun usually plural (music)

1. a note that sounds together with the main note being played and is higher and quieter than that note
2. a high quiet note that can be played on some instruments like the *violin* by touching the string very lightly
