[ək'si:d] *v (to) офиц.*

1. вступать (в должность, во владение, в организацию)  
to accede to an estate - вступить во владение  
to accede to the throne - взойти на престол
2. примыкать, присоединяться  
to accede to a confederacy - примкнуть /присоединиться/ к союзу  
to accede to a treaty - *дип.* присоединиться к договору (*на правах подписавшей стороны*)
3. соглашаться  
to accede to a request - соглашаться с просьбой, удовлетворить просьбу  
to accede to a proposal - принять предложение  
my application for a change of department was acceded to - моё заявление о переводе в другой отдел было удовлетворено
4. *юр.* увеличиваться в результате приращения (*об имуществе*)

Word Origin:

late Middle English (in the general sense 'come forward, approach'): from Latin *accedere*, from *ad-* 'to' + *cedere* 'give way, yield'.

**accede to something** *phrasal verb formal*

1. to agree to a demand, proposal etc, especially after first disagreeing with it ⇒ **accession**:  
the doctor's refusal to accede to his patient's request
2. if someone accedes to the ↑**throne**, they become king or queen ⇒ **accession**
