*adjective*1. **usually before noun** (formal) higher or nearer the top than other things

• the uppermost branches of the tree

2. **not usually before noun** more important than other things in a particular situation• These thoughts were **uppermost in my mind** .

• Defence is no longer uppermost in their priorities.

*adverb* (formal)

in the highest position; facing upwards

• Place the material on a flat surface, shiny side uppermost.
