1. **transitive** ~ **sth** to fit the parts of sth together again after it has been taken apart
  - We had to take the table apart and reassemble it upstairs.
2. **intransitive** to meet together again as a group after a break
  - The class reassembled after lunch.

1. **[transitive]** to bring together the different parts of something to make a whole again, after they have been separated:
  - The equipment had to be dismantled and reassembled at each new location.
2. **[intransitive]** if a group of people reassemble, they meet together again after a period apart:
  - Parliament reassembled after a seven-week break.
