[rɪ'sɪnd] *v*

- 1) отменять, брать обратно
he refused to rescind his order - он отказался отменить свой приказ
- 2) аннулировать, объявлять недействительным
to rescind a vote - признать результаты голосования недействительными
- 3) расторгать (*контракт и т. п.*)

Word Origin:

mid 16th cent.: from Latin *rescindere*, from *re-* (expressing intensive force) + *scindere* 'to divide, split'.
