1. **transitive, intransitive ~ (sth) | ~ (from sb)** if you exude a particular feeling or quality, or it exudes from you, people can easily see that you have it
 - She exuded confidence.
2. **transitive, intransitive** if sth exudes a liquid or smell, or a liquid or smell exudes from somewhere, the liquid, etc. comes out slowly
 - ~ **sth** The plant exudes a sticky fluid.
 - ~ **(from sth)** An awful smell exuded from the creature's body.
