Syn: ↑echo
 - Her voice reverberatedaround the hall.
 - The crash reverberatedthrough the house.
2. **intransitive** ~ (with/to sth) (of a place) to seem to shake because of a loud noise
 - The hall reverberatedwith the sound of music and dancing.
3. **intransitive** (formal) to have a strong effect on people for a long time or over a large area
 - Repercussions of the case continue to reverberatethrough the financial world.
