- ~ **sth** to become larger, more important, etc. than sb/sth
 - Demand is outstripping supply.
- ~ **sth** to be faster, better or more successful than sb you are competing against

Syn: ↑surpass

- Their latest computer outstrips all its rivals.
- ~ **sb** to run faster than sb in a race so that you pass them
 - She soon outstripped the slower runners.
