- countable** a particular habit or way of speaking or behaving that sb has but is not aware of
 - **nervous/odd/irritating mannerisms**
- uncountable** too much use of a particular style in painting or writing
- Mannerism uncountable** a style in 16th century Italian art that did not show things in a natural way but made them look strange or out of their usual shape

- He has this irritating mannerism of constantly scratching his nose.
- Ask a friend to tell you whether you have any irritating mannerisms.
- He had been learning the great man's speeches and studying his mannerisms.

- **mannerism** a way of speaking or a small movement of your face or body that is part of your usual behaviour: Even her mannerisms are the same as her sister's.
- **custom** something that people in a particular society do because it is traditional or the accepted thing to do: It is the custom to take off your shoes when you enter a house.
- **tradition** a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has existed for a long time: The tradition of giving Easter eggs goes back hundreds of years. | In many countries, it's a tradition for the bride to wear white. | It was a family tradition to go for a walk on Christmas Day.
- **practice** something that people often do, especially as part of their work or daily life: The hotel has ended the practice of leaving chocolates in guests' rooms.
