**noun**

1. a period of teaching in a university that involves discussion between an individual student or a small group of students and a <sup>↑</sup>tutor
  - The total number of hours spent in lectures, tutorials and practicals varies according to the course of study.
2. a short book or computer program that gives information on a particular subject or explains how sth is done
  - An online tutorial is provided

Word Origin:

early 18th cent.: from Latin *tutorius* (from *tueri* 'to watch, guard') + <sup>↑</sup>-al.
