**Word Origin:**

early 19th cent.: from Afrikaans **kommandeer**, from Dutch **commanderen**, from French **commander** 'to command', from late Latin **commandare**, from **com-** (expressing intensive force) + **mandare** 'commit, command'.

**Example Bank:**

- A group of young men had commandeered a truck, and were driving around the town in it.
- The soldiers had commandeered the farm and the villa five months ago.
