to repudiate the authorship of a book - отрекаться /отказываться/ от авторства
to repudiate one's former friends - отречься от (своих) старых друзей
to repudiate one's statement - отказаться от своего заявления
- отвергать, не принимать
to repudiate smb.'s gift - отвергнуть чей-л. подарок
to repudiate a doctrine - отвергать доктрину
to repudiate a charge - отвергнуть обвинение
- отказываться от уплаты долга; аннулировать долги (*особ. государственные*)
- разводиться по одностороннему заявлению (*обыкн. мужа*)

Word Origin:

late Middle English (originally an adjective in the sense 'divorced'): from Latin *repudiatus* 'divorced, cast off', from *repudium* 'divorce'.

Example Bank:

- Borrowers have begun repudiating their debt obligations.
- The buyer is entitled to repudiate the contract within a reasonable period of time.
