Word Origin:

mid 16th cent.: from Latin, literally beak (from **rodere** 'gnaw'). The word was originally used (at first in the plural **rostra**) to denote part of the Forum in Rome, which was decorated with the beaks of captured galleys, and was used as a platform for public speakers.
