Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (as a term in rhetoric, denoting the turning of an argument against the person who put it forward): from Latin *inversio(n-)*, from the verb *invertere* literally ‘turn inside out’, from *in-* ‘into’ + *vertere* ‘to turn’.
