- 1) *мед.* делать (предохранительную) прививку  
 he was inoculated with the smallpox serum - ему привили оспу  
 children were inoculated against diphtheria - детям сделали прививку против дифтерита
- 2) вселять, насаждать (*мысли, идеи и т. п.*); внушать; заражать  
 they tried to inoculate him with wisdom - они пытались образумить его  
 to be inoculated with the poison of jealousy - быть отравленным ядом ревности
2. *сад.* прививать глазком, инокулировать
3. *воен. разг.* проводить подготовку войск в условиях, приближённых к боевым
4. *хим.* затравливать (*кристаллизацию*)

Word Origin:

late Middle English (in the sense 'graft a bud or shoot into a different plant'): from Latin **inoculat-** 'grafted', from the verb **inoculare**, from **in-** 'into' + **oculus** 'eye, bud'. The sense 'vaccinate' dates from the early 18th cent.
