Derived Word ↑**inductively**Word Origin:[**inductive inductively**] late Middle English (in the sense 'leading to'): from Old French **inductif**, **-ive** or late Latin **inductivus**'**hypothetical**' (later '**inducing, leading to**'), from Latin **inducere** '**lead in**', from **in-** '**into**' + **ducere** '**to lead**'. Sense 1 dates from the mid 18th cent.**inductive**
