- 1. краска, краситель, красящее вещество
  - synthetic dye - синтетическая краска
  - fast dye - прочная /стойкая/ краска
  - fading dye - непрочная /нестойкая/ краска
  - vat dye - кубовый краситель
  - to take a dye - окрашиваться, принимать окраску

2. краска, окраска, цвет

- rainbow dyes - цвета радуги
  - ◇ of the blackest /deepest/ dye - отъявленный прожжённый, закоренелый, отвратительный мерзкий

2. [daɪ] *v* (*dyed* [-{daɪ}d])

1) красить, окрашивать

- to dye one's hair - красить волосы
- to dye smth. red - окрасить что-л. в красный цвет
- to dye a blue over a white - перекрасить (*что-л.*) из белого в голубой цвет
- to dye smth. in the wool /in the grain/ - окрашивать что-л. в пряже, прочно пропитывать краской что-л.
- to have a dress dyed - отдать покрасить платье

2) окрашиваться, краситься, принимать краску

- to dye well - хорошо краситься

Word Origin:

Old English *dēag* (noun), *dēagian* (verb). The noun is not recorded from Old English to the late 16th cent., when it was re-formed from the verb

Example Bank:

- dyed black hair
- to dye clothes/fabric/wool

**noun** countable, uncountable

a substance that is used to change the colour of things such as cloth or hair

- black dye
- hair dye
- **natural/chemical/vegetable dyes**
