Word Origin:

late Middle English: from Old French *fermier*, from medieval Latin *firmarius*, *firmator*, from *firma* 'fixed payment', from Latin *firmare* 'fix, settle' (in medieval Latin 'contract for'), from *firmus* 'constant, firm'. The current sense originally denoted 'a bailiff' or 'steward who farmed land on the owner's behalf', or 'a tenant farmer'.
