lovely • (rather informal, especially *BrE*) that you enjoy very much; that gives you great pleasure; very attractive: ▪ What a lovely day! ▪ (= the weather is very good) ◇▪ I t'sseen lovely having you here.**delightful** • that gives you great pleasure; very attractive: ▪ a delightful little fishing village**wonderful, lovely or delightful?**All these words can describe times, events, places, sights, feelings and the weather. **Wonderful** can also describe a chance or ability. **Lovely** is the most frequent in spoken British English, but in North American English **wonderful** is the most frequent, both spoken and written. **Delightful** is used especially to talk about times, events and places.wonderful/lovely/delightful **weather /views/scenery**
