1. поведение; поступок

a very strange proceeding on his part - весьма странный поступок с его стороны

2. *pl*

1) работа, деятельность (*комиссии и т. п.*)

daily proceedings - текущие дела, повседневная работа (*комиссии и т. п.*)

to note proceedings - вести протокол

proceedings began at 4 o'clock - собрание /заседание/ началось в четыре часа

I took no part in the proceedings - я не принимал участия в происходящем

2) *юр.* судебное разбирательство судебное дело; судопроизводство; судебная процедура (*мж.* legal proceedings, proceedings at law)

proceedings in civil causes - гражданское судопроизводство

summary proceedings - суммарное /упрощённое/ производство

to take /to institute/ (legal) proceedings against smb. - начать судебное дело против кого-л.

to stay /to stop/ proceedings - приостанавливать судебное производство /дело/

to withdraw /to drop/ proceedings - прекращать судебное дело

2. **proceedings plural** an event or a series of actions

• The Mayor will open the proceedings at the City Hall tomorrow.

• We watched the proceedings from the balcony.

3. **proceedings plural** the official written report of a meeting, etc

• His paper is published in the new issue of the proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

" She has begun **divorce proceedings**.

■ verbs

• **take/bring proceedings** You may take proceedings to enforce payment.

• **begin/start proceedings** (also **institute proceedings formal**) They threatened to begin legal proceedings against him.

■ ADJECTIVES/NOUN + proceedings

• **legal proceedings** He wanted to avoid the expense and trouble of legal proceedings.

• **criminal proceedings** One of the businessmen is facing criminal proceedings.

• **civil proceedings (=not relating to a criminal charge)** The couple say they will take civil proceedings against the medics for professional misconduct.

• **divorce proceedings** His wife had threatened to start divorce proceedings.

• **bankruptcy proceedings** She faced criminal charges in addition to bankruptcy proceedings.
