Word Origin:late Middle English: from Old French **plaintif** 'plaintive' (used as a noun). The -f ending has come down through Law French; the word was originally the same as plaintive.Example Bank:

- The plaintiff claimed that the correct procedures had not been followed.
- The plaintiffs obtained an injunction in the High Court.
- the lawyer appearing on behalf of the plaintiff
