- 1. countable** sound or pictures that have been recorded on CD, DVD, video, etc
 - a recording of English music for clarinet and orchestra
 - a video recording of the wedding
- 2. uncountable** the process of making a record, film/movie, radio or television show, etc
 - during the recording of the show
 - **recording equipment**
 - a **recording studio**
 - the **recording industry** (= the industry that records and sells music)
- 3. uncountable** the process or act of writing down and storing information for official purposes
 - the recording of financial transactions
