**o'clock** [o'clock] *BrE* [ə'klɒk] <sup>m</sup> *NAmE* [ə'klaɒk] <sup>m</sup> *adverb*

used with the numbers 1 to 12 when telling the time, to mean an exact hour

- He left between five and six o'clock.
- at/after/before eleven o'clock

**one o'clock/two o'clock etc** one of the times when the clock shows the exact hour as a number from 1 to 12:

\* It's already 9 o'clock.

\* The meeting is at 10 o'clock.

▶ Do not use **o'clock** when mentioning minutes or parts of an hour: *ten past nine* (**NOT** *ten past nine o'clock*) | *half past one* (**NOT** *half past one o'clock*). Do not use **o'clock** when writing the time in the form 1.00, 2.00 etc.**o'clock**
