tell me truly what you think - скажите мне честно, что вы думаете

it has been truly stated that ... - правильно отмечалось /говорилось/, что ...

2) *книжн.* в функции вводного слова по правде говоря, честно говоря

truly, I am puzzled - по правде говоря, я озадачен

2. верно, лояльно, преданно

to serve smb. truly - верно служить кому-л.

3. 1) действительно, подлинно, по-настоящему

a truly absorbing book - по-настоящему увлекательная книга

a truly considerate host - по-настоящему внимательный хозяин

a truly difficult situation - действительно трудная ситуация

a truly good man - несомненно хороший человек

• I'm truly sorry that things had to end like this.

• I felt truly at home.

• She truly believes that none of this is her fault.

2. used to emphasize a particular quality

• a truly memorable occasion

• a truly magnificent performance

3. used to emphasize that a particular description is accurate or correct

• a truly democratic system of government

• (informal) Well, **really and truly**, things were better than expected.

• He started the first truly international ballet company.

Is it a truly representative sample?

4. **well and truly especially spoken** completely:

We were well and truly beaten.

The party was well and truly over.

5. **really and truly British English spoken** used to emphasize that something is definitely or completely true:

I couldn't believe we were really and truly going at last.

6. **yours truly**

a) used at the end of a letter, before the signature

b) *informal* used humorously to mean yourself:

So, yours truly was left to clean up.
