Adviser or consultant? An **adviser** may be employed permanently by an organization; a **consultant** is usually brought in to work on a project for a fixed period.

- You ought to consult an independent legal adviser.

- As your legal adviser, it is my duty to warn you against it.
- He became one of the king's closest and most trusted advisers.
- He was Chief Scientific Adviser to the government
