1. (informal) a way of emphasizing that sth is true and that there is no doubt about it
 - I definitely remember sending the letter.
 - 'Was it what you expected?' 'Yes, definitely.'
 - 'Do you plan to have children?' 'Definitely not!'
 - Some old people want help; others most definitely do not.
2. in a way that is certain or that shows that you are certain
 - The date of the move has not been definitely decided yet (= it may change).
 - Please say definitely whether you will be coming or not.

- The date of the move has not been definitely decided yet.
