1. (especially **BrE**) **countable** a district that elects its own representative to parliament
  - Unemployment is high in her constituency.
  - He owns a house in his Darlington constituency.
2. **countable + singular or plural verb** the people who live in and vote in a particular district
  - constituency opinion
3. **countable + singular or plural verb** a particular group of people in society who are likely to support a person, an idea or a product
  - There is a strong constituency of support for his proposal.

3. any group that supports or is likely to support a politician or a political party:
  - The trade unions were no longer the constituency of the Labour Party alone.
