- The book also includes summaries at the end of each chapter.
- The report will be available online in summary form.

**adjective only before noun**

1. (formal) giving only the main points of sth, not the details
  - a summary financial statement
  - I made a summary report for the records.
2. (sometimes disapproving) done immediately, without paying attention to the normal process that should be followed
  - **summary justice/execution**
  - a summary judgement
