1. a covered vehicle with no side windows in its back half, usually smaller than a lorry/truck, used for carrying goods or people
 - a furniture van
 - a police van (= for carrying police officers or prisoners)
 - a delivery van
 - a van driver
 2. (*NAmE*) a covered vehicle with side windows, usually smaller than a lorry/truck, that can carry about twelve passengers
 3. (*BrE*) a closed coach/car on a train for carrying bags, cases, etc. or mail
 - a luggage van
- Idiom: ↑in the van

Word Origin:

n. early 19th cent. ↑caravan
early 17th cent. ↑vanguard

Example Bank:

- A TV news van was parked at the entrance.
- Each band had a tour van.
- a TV detector van going round the area
- A bomb had been planted in a parked van.
- A delivery van was almost blocking the narrow street.
- On election day they drove around town in a van with a loudspeaker on the roof.
- The gang robbed a mail van, seriously injuring one of the guards.
- The van's interior was fitted with shelves.
- a mail/luggage van

1. a vehicle used especially for carrying goods, which is smaller than a ↑**truck** and has a roof and usually no windows at the sides:
 - " a delivery van
 - " a van driver
2. **American English** a large box-like car that can carry a lot of people
3. **especially British English** a railway carriage with a roof and sides, used especially for carrying goods:
 - " a luggage van
4. **be in the van (of something)** to be one of the people who are in front or who are leading a change:
 - " She was in the van of the feminist movement.
