late 16th cent.: from Anglo-Norman French *vendour* from French *vendre* or Latin *vendere* 'sell', from *venum* 'something for sale' + a variant of *dare* 'give'.

Example Bank:

- Contact the vendor and ask them their rates.
- Get a list of vendors who deliver frozen food.
- Jewellery, leather and clothes are offered by street vendors at every corner.
- The cost to the vendor of selling land by auction is normally higher than by private treaty.
