- **point** I think that's a valid point.

■ adverbs

- **equally valid** Each of these ways of looking at things is equally valid.
- **perfectly valid** It's a perfectly valid question.
- **statistically/scientifically valid** (=based on correct numbers or good research) The drug trials were scientifically valid.
