interface control - регулирование уровня раздела двух несмешивающихся жидкостей
- стык, область контакта, взаимодействия (*между чем-л.*)
at the interface of - на стыке
interface between engineering and science - взаимодействие техники и науки
interface between the known and unknown - на стыке между известным и неизвестным
the high school - college interface - координация между средней и высшей школой
- 1) средство осуществления взаимного воздействия *или* взаимосвязи
2) *вчт.* устройство сопряжения; связующее звено, интерфейс(*между человеком и ЭВМ или машиной*)
the man-machine interface - человеко-машинный интерфейс диалоговый режим (*работы ЭВМ*)
