- intransitive, transitive (biology)** (of plants, animals, etc.) to develop over time, often many generations, into forms that are better adapted to survive changes in their environment

Word Origin:

early 17th cent. (in the general sense 'make more complex, develop'): from Latin *evolvere* from *e-* (variant of *ex-*) 'out of' + *volvere* 'to roll'.

Example Bank:

- Africa and its wildlife evolved together.
- Monkeys in the New World evolved quite separately from those in the Old World.
- More complex animals gradually evolved from these very simple creatures.
- Online games tend to evolve over time.
