• a perfect/smooth/safe landing
• the first Apollo **moon landing**
• The pilot was forced to make **an emergency landing** .
• a landing site
Opp: **↑take-off**

3. **countable** an act of bringing soldiers to land in an area that is controlled by the enemy
4. (**BrE** also **'landing stage**) **countable** a flat wooden platform on the water where boats let people get on and off, and load and unload goods
Syn: **↑jetty**

2. [**countable**] the floor at the top of a set of stairs or between two sets of stairs:
the first-floor landing
3. [**countable**] the action of bringing soldiers onto land that is controlled by the enemy:
the first landings of American Marines at Da Nang
4. [**countable**] a **↑landing stage**

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
