 - ~ **sth to sth** Assign a different colour to each different type of information.
 - ~ **sth sth** The painting cannot be assigned an exact date.
- ~ **sth to sb (law)** to say that your property or rights now belong to sb else
 - The agreement assigns copyright to the publisher.
 - She has assigned the lease to her daughter.

Middle English: from Old French **assigner**, **assiner**, from Latin **assignare**, from **ad-** 'to' + **signare** 'to sign'.
