  - **And they all lived happily ever after** (= used as the end of a **↑fairy tale** ) .
2. by good luck  
**Syn:** **↑fortunately**
  - Happily, the damage was only slight.
3. willingly
  - I'll happily help, if I can.
4. (formal) in a way that is suitable or appropriate
  - This suggestion did not fit very happily with our existing plans.

1. in a happy way:
  - Michelle smiled happily.
  - I'm a happily married man.
  - So she married the prince, and they lived happily ever after (=used at the end of children's stories to say that someone was happy for the rest of their life).
2. [**sentence adverb**] fortunately:
  - Happily, his injuries were not serious.
3. very willingly:
  - I'd happily go for you.
  - Most restaurants will happily accept payment by cheque.

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
