- She's making her New York debut at Carnegie Hall.
- The group's debut album was released last week.

verb

- 1. **intransitive** (of a performer or show) to make a first public appearance
 - The ballet will debut next month in New York.
- 2. **transitive ~ sth** (especially NAmE, **business**) to present a new product or advertising campaign to the market
 - They will debut the products at the trade show.
 - The market debuted its 'Get Fresh' campaign last fall.
 - They have promised to debut the software by the end of the year.

- 1. [**intransitive**] to appear in public or become available for the first time:

The show will debut next Monday at 8.00 pm.

2. [transitive] to introduce a product to the public for the first time ⇒ **release SYN launch:**

Ralph Lauren debuted his autumn collection in Paris last week.
