Word Origin:

mid 18th cent. (originally denoting a shop selling provisions or alcohol in a barracks or garrison town): from French *cantine*, from Italian *cantina* 'cellar'. A French use of *cantine* denoting a small compartmented case for carrying bottles of wine may have given rise to sense 3.
