1. people use Huh? at the end of questions, suggestions, etc, especially when they want sb to agree with them

• So you won't be coming tonight, huh?

• Let's get out of here, huh?

2. people say Huh! to show anger, surprise, disagreement, etc. or to show that they are not impressed by sth

• Huh! Is that all you've done?

• 'Try to understand.' 'Huh! What is there to understand?'

3. (*NAmE*) (*BrE* **eh**) people say Huh? to show that they have not heard what sb has just said

• 'Are you feeling OK?' 'Huh?'

2. *especially American English* used at the end of a question, often to ask for agreement:

" Not a bad little place, huh?

3. used to show disagreement or surprise, or to show that you do not find something impressive:

" 'She looks nice.' 'Huh! Too much make-up, if you ask me.'
