■ types of basket

- a **wastepaper/waste basket** (=for paper you throw away) He threw her letter in the wastepaper basket.
- a **laundry/clothes basket** (=for dirty clothes) Will you please put your socks in the laundry basket?
- a **shopping basket** She paid for the apples and put them in her shopping basket.
- a **picnic basket** We took a picnic basket and a rug.
- a **bread basket** (=for serving bread) There was a bread basket on the table.
- a **fruit basket** (=containing fruits) He had a fruit basket sent up to her hotel room.
- a **hanging basket** (=for putting plants in and hanging outside) All the shops had hanging baskets outside their doors.
- a **wicker basket** (=made from the hard stems of a plant) She stores her vegetables in pretty wicker baskets.
