Which Word?:**court / law court / court of law**

All these words can be used to refer to a place where legal trials take place. **Court** and (formal) **court of law** usually refer to the actual room where cases are judged. **Courtroom** is also used for this. **Law court** (*BrE*) is more often used to refer to the building:

- The prison is opposite the law court. **Courthouse** is used for this in *NAmE*.

Example Bank:

- His lawyer read a statement outside the courtroom.
- She could face a bitter courtroom battle.
- The judge came back into the packed courtroom.
- There were shouts from his supporters in the courtroom.
