• It's a pity our trips to New York don't coincide.

• ~ with sth The strike was timed to coincide with the party conference.

2. intransitive (formal) (of ideas, opinions, etc.) to be the same or very similar

• The interests of employers and employees do not always coincide.

• ~ with sth Her story coincided exactly with her brother's.

3. intransitive (formal) (of objects or places) to meet; to share the same space

• At this point the two paths coincide briefly.

• ~ with sth The present position of the house coincides with that of an earlier dwelling.

Word Origin:

early 18th cent. (in the sense 'occupy the same space'): from medieval Latin *coincidere*, from *co-* 'together with' + *incidere* 'fall upon or into'.

• His entry to the party coincided with his marriage.

• When our vacations coincided, we often holidayed together.

planned/timed/arranged to coincide

• The show is timed to coincide with the launch of a new book.

2. [not in progressive] if two people's ideas, opinions etc coincide, they are the same ⇒ **coincidence** :

• The interests of the US and those of the islanders may not coincide.

• The cloth had a natural look which coincided perfectly with the image Laura sought.

3. to meet or be in the same place:

• The journey coincides in part with the Pennine Way.
