- 1. countable** a hard pointed part that grows, usually in pairs, on the heads of some animals, such as sheep and cows. **Horns** are often curved
- 2. uncountable** the hard substance of which animal **horns** are made
- 3. countable** a simple musical instrument that consists of a curved metal tube that you blow into
 - a hunting horn
- 4. countable** (especially BrE) = †French horn
 - a horn concerto
- 5. countable** a device in a vehicle for making a loud sound as a warning or signal
 - to **honk your car horn**
 - (BrE) to **sound/toot your horn**
 - Behind him, a horn blared.

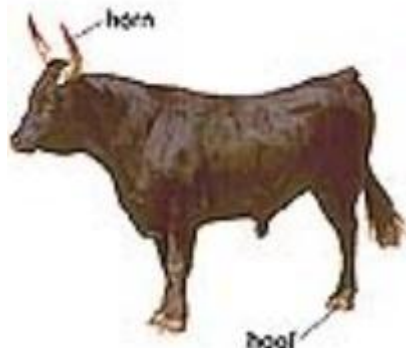

- I. **French 'horn** *BrE* " *AmE* " (also **horn** *especially British English*) *noun* [countable]
a musical instrument made of **↑brass**, that is curved round into a circle with a wide opening at one end

1. ANIMAL

- a) [countable] the hard pointed thing that grows, usually in pairs, on the heads of animals such as cows and goats ⇒ **antlers**
- b) [uncountable] the substance that animals' horns are made of:
a knife with a horn handle
- c) [countable] a part of an animal's head that sticks out like a horn, for example on a **↑snail**
- 2. " **ON A CAR** [countable] the thing in a vehicle that you use to make a loud sound as a signal or warning
sound/toot/honk/blow your horn (=make a noise with your horn)

3. MUSICAL INSTRUMENT [countable]

- a) a musical instrument like a long metal tube that is wide at one end, that you play by blowing
- b) *informal* a **↑trumpet**
- c) a **↑French horn**
- d) a musical instrument made from an animal's horn ⇒ **↑English horn**

4. **drinking horn/powder horn etc** a container in the shape of an animal's horn, used in the past for drinking from, carrying **↑gunpowder** etc

5. **draw/pull in your horns** to reduce the amount of money you spend

6. **be on the horns of a dilemma** to be in a situation in which you have to choose between two equally unpleasant or difficult situations

⇒ **blow your own trumpet/horn** at **↑blow**¹(21), ⇒ **lock horns** at **↑lock**¹(6), ⇒ **take the bull by the horns** at **↑bull**¹(3)
