**Word Origin:**

Middle English (as a legal term): from Old French **verifier**, from medieval Latin **verificare**, from **verus** 'true'.

**Example Bank:**

- I'll leave you to verify whether these claims are true.
- Please verify that your password was entered correctly.
- Several witnesses confirmed/verified his story.
