## backyard BrE , AmE , , back 'yard /ˌbækˈjɑːd/\$-ˈjɑːrd/ noun [countable]

1. *British English* a small area behind a house, covered with a hard surface
2. *American English* an area of land behind a house, often covered with grass:
  - The old man grew vegetables in his backyard.
3. **in sb's own backyard** *informal* very near where someone lives, works etc:
  - Americans would probably react differently to the war if it was in their own back yard.
4. **not in my backyard** used to say that you do not want something to happen near where you live

—backyard *adjective* [only before noun]:

- a backyard pool
