2. 1) **передавать**

to transmit a tradition to the younger generation - передавать традицию молодому поколению
to transmit motion to smth. - передавать /сообщать/ чему-л. движение
these plates were transmitted from firm to firm - эти гравюры передавались от одной фирмы к другой

2) **передавать, переносить**

to transmit an infection - распространять инфекцию
rats transmit disease - крысы - переносчики болезней

3. **передавать по наследству**

to transmit a title [property] to one's heirs - передавать своим наследникам титул [имущество]
acquired habits are not transmitted - приобретённые привычки не передаются по наследству
my emotionalism transmitted itself to him - ему передалась моя эмоциональность

4. **посылать, отправлять**

to transmit a parcel by rail [a letter by hand] - отправлять пакет железной дорогой [письмо с посылным]
I shall transmit the money by a special messenger - я перешлю эти деньги с нарочным
the steamship company will transmit your baggage whenever it receives the word - пароходство перешлёт ваш багаж по первому требованию

5. **проводить, пропускать**

iron transmits heat - железо проводит тепло
glass transmits light - стекло пропускает свет
metals transmit electricity - металлы проводят электричество /являются проводниками/, металлы обладают (высокой) электропроводностью
